Registration:

Registration for courses must be completed by June 3. Students must register at his/her home campus through the counselor.

Registration will continue at Northbrook High School on June 2 - 4, 8:00 - 11:00 a.m. and 12 noon – 2 p.m.

Students may register late on June 9 for an additional late fee of \$25. Students **MUST** bring a registration form from their counselor. **Registration after June 3 will only be accepted with cash or money orders as payment.**

Registration for non-Spring Branch ISD students will be held at Spring Woods High School starting May 1, 9:00-11:30 a.m. and 1:00p.m.-2:30 p.m. Students **must** bring written approval from their school counselor.

Tuition:

\$200 per session (½ credit)

\$550 all three sessions (1 ½ credit)

Free & Reduced Discount (Retake Courses only)

\$180 per session (½ credit)

\$500 all three sessions (1 ½ credit)

\$50 Out-of-District fee (non-SBISD students)

Transportation:

Free transportation is provided. Buses run once in the morning and once in the afternoon (see your counselor for **Bus Routes**). Time and routes are subject to change based on availability. Bus stops are located at the closest SBISD school (elementary, middle, or high).

Attendance:

Perfect attendance is necessary for students to be successful in the short, intense summer program. Credit cannot be given if a student misses more than 5 **class periods** (equivalent of one complete school day) or has more than 5 tardies during each 10 day session. A tardy of more than fifteen (15) minutes equals one absence for that class period. There is no differentiation between excused and unexcused absences.

Progress Reports and Report Cards

After the 5th day of class, a progress report will sent home with the students. Report cards will be issued following the completion of the session.

Discipline:

All students must demonstrate, with minimal guidance and support, a reasonable expectation of an ability and willingness to conform to dress code and behavior standards of Spring Branch ISD general education expectations. The expectations are clearly outlined in the student handbook. Students may be suspended or dismissed for unacceptable behavior, which is at the principal's discretion. Suspension or dismissal may result in loss of credit with no refund (see Attendance).

Dress Code:

Dress code must conform to the dress code guidelines as outlined in the Spring Branch ISD Student/Parent Handbook.

Food Services:

Breakfast will be served from 7:00-7:25 a.m. A sack lunch will also be served. Both meals are **free**. Snack and soda machines will be available during the breaks.
