1. What qualities do you possess which enable you to make contributions to the DIT?

I have been with the district for many years and have seen very positive changes as we work to reach our T-2-4. Our 4<sup>th</sup> math and science scores at Rummel Creek are consistently the highest in the district and our use of differentiated instruction with technology like Imagine Math, MAP individualized lessons, Its Learning, and STEMscopes are great examples of extending the classroom beyond school hours. I love SBISD and want to help move us to the next level as an innovative district that is an instructional leader in the state. Both my children went to Westchester Academy, so I am an advocate for charter schools within the district. My teaching experience is also varied. I have worked with struggling students during summer school at Westwood, Thornwood, and Spring Branch Elementary. I taught all subjects at Rummel Creek, Frostwood, and Bunker Hill Elementary. I have even been a campus administrator at Meadow Wood and Memorial Drive so I have a unique perspective that can see a



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bigger picture of the district's needs and hope that I have the opportunity to serve on the DIT in the future.

2. What are the major challenges you see SBISD facing in the next two years?

Retaining qualified teachers is always a struggle when surrounding districts pay more, and helping teachers with classroom management as more students are either "over-managed" by their parents so they struggle to problem solve on their own or when students' behavior is a challenge because parents or teachers are ill-equipped to set high expectations. Parenting and teaching today is so much more of a challenge than just 10 years ago.

3. What role do you see the DIT having in addressing these challenges?

The DIT can help identify challenges we face in the classroom and brainstorm strategies that work on other campus' or evaluate new initiatives effectiveness on our campuses using data driven reflection strategies. We can also help provide insight on needed parent or teacher education series.

4. Please discuss any issue/concern/observation you have that has not been addressed.

Technology is changing education for the better, but there are ramifications socially when we stop teaching children the basic tenants of positive human interaction and cooperative learning. I hope our district continues to shape the whole child and works to maintain the social and emotional piece that is still needed in classrooms today.
