RECENT GROUNDBREAKINGS



NOTTINGHAM ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A groundbreaking celebration was held in February 2022 for the replacement campus. A new 106,265-square-foot building will be built on-site and serve 750 students. A large, open library will serve as the heart of the school, and collaborative areas adjacent to classrooms will offer flexible furniture and active walls to support learning.



MEMORIAL DRIVE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A groundbreaking celebration was held in December 2022 for the replacement campus. A new 91,263 square-foot building will replace the 58,965-square-foot building and serve 550 students. The school design provides upgrades to enhance the learning experience for students and staff. The campus has moved off-site while the new school is built.



WOODVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A groundbreaking celebration was held in January 2023 for the replacement campus. A new 104,094-square-foot building will replace the current 70,508-square-foot.

The rebuilt Woodview will serve 700 students and bring new collaborative spaces that promote student learning. The campus has moved off-site while the new school is built.

2017 BOND PROGRAM - MAJOR PROJECTS COMPLETED



BUNKER HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A grand opening for the new Bunker Hill Elementary School took place in September 2022. The **110,000-square-foot building** is designed to accommodate 750 students. The school brings students and staff together through learning pods and shared spaces. State-of-the-art classrooms and technology create a collaborative environment that promotes student learning.



LANDRUM MIDDLE SCHOOL

A grand opening for the new Landrum Middle School took place in September 2021. The **238,215-square-foot building** accommodates 1,200 students. The building features a three-story library media area allowing students and staff access to flexible learning spaces. The school also has a new 600-seat auditorium, two playfields, a running track and sports courts.



NORTHBROOK HIGH SCHOOL

A ribbon-cutting for the new wing of Northbrook High School took place in September 2022. The **45,265-square-foot building** strengthens collaboration and promotes engagement between students and staff.



HUNTERS CREEK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

A grand opening for the new Hunters Creek Elementary took place in September 2022. The **107,686-square-foot building** is designed to accommodate 700 students. Collaborative areas extend learning outside the classroom for both individual and multi-class use. With overhead doors, the school's cafeteria and gym are designed to open into one contiguous space.



MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL

A ribbon-cutting for the new wing of Memorial High took place in January 2022. The four-story, **161,249-square-foot instructional and cafeteria building** replaces six older academic buildings. Work under the project also included renovations to the campus' existing site. Together, it elevates Memorial to new heights in design and function for both students and staff.



STRATFORD HIGH SCHOOL

A ribbon-cutting for the new auditorium at Stratford High School took place in April 2022. The **35,405-square-foot facility** provides seating for 1,000 with incredible style and functionality. The auditorium is home to the school's awardwinning drama program, Stratford Playhouse.





The 2017 Bond Program continues the transformation of district facilities that began with the 2007 Bond Program. The program will:

- REPLACE the remaining nine oldest elementary schools and one middle school.
- PROVIDE classroom and facility renovations (multiple locations).
- UPGRADE safety and security, building systems and technology at all campuses, including classroom furniture for secondary schools.
- REPLACE Career and Technical Education (CTE) classroom equipment.
- REPLACE aged music instruments and uniforms.
- UPGRADE athletics equipment and facilities, including four turf fields.
- REPLACE older buses.

\$381.6 MILLION

Approved by 73 percent of the vote in May 2022, the 2022 Bond Program will:

- REBUILD the Guthrie Center, SBISD's central CTE facility; and make CTE classroom, lab and facility improvements at Guthrie's Agricultural Science Center, four SBISD high schools, six middle schools and two specialty campuses.
- ADDRESS identified district facility needs including additional classrooms at Valley Oaks Elementary.
- ADDRESS new building stormwater detention and code requirements put into place after Hurricane Harvey.
- FUND technology infrastructure improvements that support CTE programming and lifecycle replacements of audio-visual instructional tools and student and teacher devices.
