Supporting Your Child's Literacy

10 Reading Genres to Know About



Realistic Fiction

Defined: A genre of stories that are made up but could very well happen in real life. These stories often take place in settings familiar to your child — like schools — which makes them more relatable.



Poetry

Defined: A genre where verses, that may or may not rhyme, are written to evoke a feeling from a reader.

Historical Fiction

Defined: A genre of stories that didn't really happen, but are based on events in history. They're perfect for kids who love to explore the past, and are often full of big adventures. (One of the most famous examples of historical fiction for kids is the I Survived series.)









Traditional Literature

Defined: A genre in which stories are passed down from one generation to the next, such as tall tales and folktales. You probably heard a number of these as a child.

Science Fiction

Defined: A genre of stories that are not very likely to happen in real life, but are generally set in the future and tie in with science and technology. (These STEAM Books can also ignite your little learner's love of science.)









Fantasy

Defined: A genre of stories that are made up and include ideas that could not happen in real life, often involving magical or supernatural elements, such as talking animals.


Mystery

Defined: A genre of stories that involve a secret or crime that needs to be solved, usually by the end of the story. Because kids need to pay close attention to details and follow cause and effect, mystery books can be a great way to boost comprehension and other literacy skills. Informational

Defined: A type of nonfiction that provides factual information about a particular topic such as sports, animals, or historical events.

Biography

Defined: An account of someone's life written by another person. These books are great not only for reading, but for inspiring!





Autobiography

Defined: An account of someone's life written by that person.

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





ABC Books


Benefit:

- practice early reading skills












Emergent Story Books


Benefits:

- comfort in repetition
- increases understanding of story structure
- increased knowledge of story language
- using pictures to make meaning
- begin to read some words
- learn that what they are reading must match the part of the book they are in
- further develops concepts of print



- improves students' reading comprehension












Graphic Novels for Levels G(12) - N(30)

- helps develop tone and phrasing
- builds vocabulary
- allows for higher level thinking, especially when you have someone to discuss it
