<u>Purpose</u>

Committee Charge

- Provide governance over the district's electronic communication and data management (CQ-R) Administrative Guideline for Internet Content Management and Filtering
- Maintain compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)
- Provide input from your role's perspective
- Provide feedback on the district's Internet content management and filtering practices
- Consider requests from employees to use or unblock a blocked site
- Make recommendations regarding approval or disapproval of disabling the filter

Meetings

- The committee will hold a minimum of two meetings a year. A majority of committee members should be present to hold any scheduled meeting.
- Failure to attend two consecutive meetings will result in removal from the committee
