1. What qualities do you possess which enable you to make contributions to the DIT?

I also think that finances and retention of teachers is something the district faces.

I think that the district improvement team can review our district of innovation plan and hold the district accountable to those ideas and plans that were formed from the district of innovation committee. I also think the DIT is a forum for people to be able to voice concerns from their particular campus and/or experience. Often times, the district does not know the full picture of what is going on on a campus and decisions are made pre-maturely. As a DIT we need to reinforce the policies and procedures put forth from the school board and the superintendent. It is our job (as a DIT member) to bring concerns from our colleagues and community forward so the district can get an idea of what is truly taking place in our schools and communities.

We have some of the most dedicated educators in the city in our district. It is important for us to hold onto our educators and more importantly for us to hold onto our kids.
