

COURSE DESCRIPTION

CERAMICS (Beginning/Intermediate/Advanced) - This class is designed for both with little or no ceramic experience BUT who want to expand their knowledge or refresh their skills as well as those with some proficiency who want to increase their technical skills. This course will foucus on hand-building, glazing techniques and studio safety. Students will create beautiful vases, masks, and sculptural forms. \$40.00 materials fee payable to teacher. **(Limit 10)**

DANCE FOR ADULTS & YOUTH - Shape up with SBISDance! By learning the art of dance, students of today can step into the business world of tomorrow with poise, posture and gain confidence.

DRAWING FUNDAMENTALS - Using basic drawing materials, students will explore the fundamentals of drawing. Through various hands-on activities, this course will touch upon observation, shape, line, negative space, and texture.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (E.S.L.) - For the non-English speaker or those who want to improve their English. (Four levels: Beginners, Intermediate, Advanced & Advanced Conversation)

ESTATE PLANNING FOR UPPER-MIDDLE CLASS FAMILIES - Estate planning isn't just for the super wealthy; it's also for middle and upper-middle class families. It's the most neglected part of family financial plannin but it's critically important. a well designed estate plan helps keep your assets from passing to unintended beneficiaries, avoids certain taxes and shields certain assets from family member's creditors. And most significantly, a good estate plan with proper documents helps avoid family fights after your funeral. This six-hour class will answer questions like: "Can and should probate be avoided? Do DIY, computer Wills work? Whish is best-a Revocable Living Trust or a Will? What kinds of Powers of Attorney do I need? how to avoid POA abuse?" The cost includes one notebook of materials per houshold. (3 weeks)

FLORAL ARRANGING - Learn floral arranging and bow making utilizing minimal amounts of purchased items and items from your own garden. Meet at the school for the first class and then go on a field trip to a local craft store to learn about supplies. Ms. Prince has previously owned her own floral shop and will be teaching you with fresh flowers and some silk flowers. **(7 weeks)**

FOOD & NUTRITION EDUCATION - This Expanded Food and Nutrition Education program will include everything from Healthy Food/Healthy Families, Making the Most of My Plate, Setting your Limits, Mealtime Miracles and more. There will also be in-class food demonstrations. You will receive a Certificate of Completion from Texas A&M Agrilife at the end of program. (8 weeks)

FOREIGN ACCENT REDUCTION - Designed for people who wish to improve their communication skills. This course provides an opportunity to learn and practice English speech sounds and patterns and to develop a better understanding of American speech and language usage, including idioms and the effects of cultural changes on the language.

<u>FRENCH</u> - Development of the four language skills: understanding, speaking, reading and writing. Students are asked to purchase <u>French: A Self -Teaching Guide, 2nd Edition</u> by Suzanne A. Hershfield-Haims. Book can be purchased online through Amazon.com.

G.E.D. PREPARATION - (English & Espanol) - Covers all five areas you will be tested on when you take the G.E.D. Test at a location of your choice. We ONLY prepare you for the test. **We do not do Testing.**

GERMAN - Students will learn the sounds and will learn the development of the four language skills: understanding, speaking, reading and writing.

GUITAR GROUP - Music fundamentals, learn a song-a-week. Bring your own guitar, capo and text: Guitar Method-Hal Leonard, Pub. ISBN # 0-88188-139-2 (thru music store or on-line)

MOSTLY WATERCOLOR - In this class we will focus on liquid watercolor as our main medium. We will start with a technique sheet that combines other materials with watercolor and some of the basics of watercolor. We will also use marbling, collage, colored pencils, china markers, patterns, painting outside the lines and more...If you are a beginner, this is the perfect class for you.

PREPARING FOR CITIZENSHIP - This class is designed to prepare beginning and intermediate level adults students for the naturalization process. **Prerequisite:** Must have completed Intermediate E.S.L.

QUILTING CLUB - This is a student-directed Quilting Club. No Teacher or instruction provided. This is not your grandmother's quilt, but she would have loved it! Come and make a heirloom quilt and join the fun. Suitable for ALL EXPERIENCED QUILTERS. This is a FUN, progress-at-your-own-pace class. (LIMIT 8) (12 weeks)

READING SHAKESPEAR FOR FUN - Join us for a fun, informal class designed to explore the Bard's pest-beloved classics while giving the mnd and lungs a bit of exercise! For decades, Shakespeare has been read aloud by groups across the nation to five community members of all ages a chance to explore the imaginative, yet practical world, created by one of history's greates palywrights. Come and enjoy! (5 wks)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

SEWING - BEGINNING/INTERMEDIATE - Learn how to select fabric, use commercial patterns, and sew garments for you or your family. All students work individually and choose projects with the degree of difficulty that matches their skill level. For example if you've sewn but haven't put a zipper, in you may do that. It is extremely important that you attend the first class because all the foundation information will be taught at that time. No supplies are needed for the first class. Teens welcome. (Limit 8)

SPANISH I - Students will learn the sounds of the language as spoken mainly in the United States. Grammar covered will be the use of the three basic ver groups -AR, -ER and -IR verbs, Irregular verbs and Stem-Changing verbs in the Present Tense. Several irregular verbs: ser, estar, & gustar will be presented. Other areas covers will include: nouns, articles and adjectives.

SPANISH II - Students will review Spanish I. Focus remains on a combination of reading, writing, listening and speaking. Grammar will continue in the present tense verb usage. Additional study of different types of adjectives and other grammatical discussion will continue. It also covers: numbers, days, months, dates, expressing time and a more advanced coverage of adjectives.

SPANISH III - Students will review Spanish I & II, present tense stem-changing, reflexive verbs, present progressive tense, comparisons of adjectives, direct object pronouns, formal commands, intro to the subjunctive mood, speaking, reading and writing.

SPANISH CONVERSATION - Prerequisite: Must have completed Spanish III. Must know Past Tense.

During the semester, a few projects may include; faux finishing, furniture painting, basic upholstery, creating/upcycling a lamp. (Limit 10)

VOICE-OVERS...NOW IS YOUR TIME - In what could be the one of most enlightening 2 hours you've ever spent, this class will show you how YOU could actually begin using your speaking voice for commercials, films, videos and more! Most people go about it the wrong way. In this class, you will learn about a unique, outside the box way to cash in on one of the most lucrative full or part-time careers out there! This is a business that you can handle on your own terms, on your own turf, in your own time, and with practically no overhead! And NOW is the best time to make this happen as new companies are looking for new voices like never before. This exciting and fun class could be the game changer you've been looking for!

YOUR LIFE, YOUR RETIREMENT - Baby Boomers and Gen Xers, facing 25 to 30 yrs. in retirement, will face pressures and challenges unknown to previous generations but most are unprepared or under-prepared.
