1. What qualities do you possess which enable you to make contributions to the DIT?

Qualities I possess that enable me to make contributions to the DIT are my teaching experience, organization, ability to look for details, and thoughtful reflection. Being my 22nd year of teaching, I have learned from the many opportunities SBISD has provided for its teachers and students. I have implemented SBISD programs and have been able to see how they impact students the most to help them be successful. I have also had time to serve as campus team leader, participate on CIT and PAT, have been part of district committees like technology and math, and serve as a mentor to new teachers. I am very organized which will help with organizing my time to coincide with the DIT schedule commitment, take notes and/or collect data when needed, and stay on top of the duties asked of me. I look for details. I've always felt it's better to have too much information than not enough. I like to also put myself in someone else's shoes to see how they might interpret shared information and whether something should be clarified. Another contribution is thoughtful reflection. When part of a discussion, for example, I may not jump in with a response right away. I like to be able to process the information and think



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about it from different viewpoints before I respond. I try to think about the opinions and ideas of others and how they can all be part of a solution.

- 2. What are the major challenges you see SBISD facing in the next two years? Some major challenges I see facing SBISD in the next two years are some challenges we have been working on. T-2-4 for example. Yes, our numbers are rising for students that continue their education beyond high school, but we can still do so much more to provide students with information about the T-2 part. Perhaps it's an elementary school struggle. All promotion and support seems to focus on 4 year college programs. Starting in elementary, students need to be more aware of the opportunities available to them at the T-2 levels. Some of our students are builders and creators and they need to know what is available to them to help support and develop this in their learning from kindergarten and beyond. Another challenge I see is time. There is never enough time. We seem to focus on too many new programs at one time instead of choosing the top one or two based on need. Choosing one or two programs to focus on would help all of our teachers and staff become masters as opposed to just being proficient (or less) in twenty different things. Do we do things well, or do we just get by. SBISD has never been a district that celebrates "just getting by." SBISD celebrates excellence which we need for our students AND teachers.
- 3. What role do you see the DIT having in addressing these challenges? I feel the DIT has the ability to bring different people from the community together to problem solve, address issues, and celebrate successes that impact the students in the community.
- 4. Please discuss any issue/concern/observation/opportunity you have identified that has not been addressed. Something I feel that should be addressed is alignment and cooperativity. SBISD has many committees at the district and campus levels. We are all working towards improving learning, and making changes so that our students are as successful as possible. However, there is often very little communication among the committees as a whole. With curriculum for example, each subject is in a little world of their own and lesson plans are created that make it seem like that particular subject has the largest amount of time. Committee members are never together to truly look at what a school day looks like with the time that is truly available for actual content instruction. Members don't meet to see how the different subject areas can work together to see how to support the other subject areas so that more time can be spent on true instruction and engagement rather than "did I get it all in?" We always seem to be adding more, but not always really looking at what we can do to be more efficient or actually excel in.
