September - Creation of analysis rubric, brainstorming of regulation options, individual options, package options

October - Evaluation of options against the rubric, section of top 2-3 "packages" November - analysis of options using real student transcripts, draft findings and recommendations

December - refinement of findings & recommendations, presentation to the Board
