
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
T-2-4 is our singular, strategic goal for **Every SBISD graduate** to attain a technical certificate, military training, or a two-year or four-year degree.


























Our Charge

The Committee is charged by the Board of Trustees with the responsibility of working collaboratively and cooperatively with the superintendent and the superintendent's administrative designees to develop a defined vision for a **T-2-4 Ready Graduate** at the conclusion of key transition years: 5th grade, 8th grade, and 12th grade.

The Vision will provide clarity for the academic and social-emotional characteristics of an SBISD student who is prepared to achieve T-2-4. The Vision should include, but not be limited to, the attributes, skillsets, competencies and experiences students need to develop and achieve by key transitional milestones as they matriculate through our system.

The Committee is charged with beginning its work in fall 2020, with the development of a defined vision for a **T-2-4 Ready Graduate** at 5th, 8th and 12th grades to be presented to the SBISD Board of Trustees no later than February 2021.


