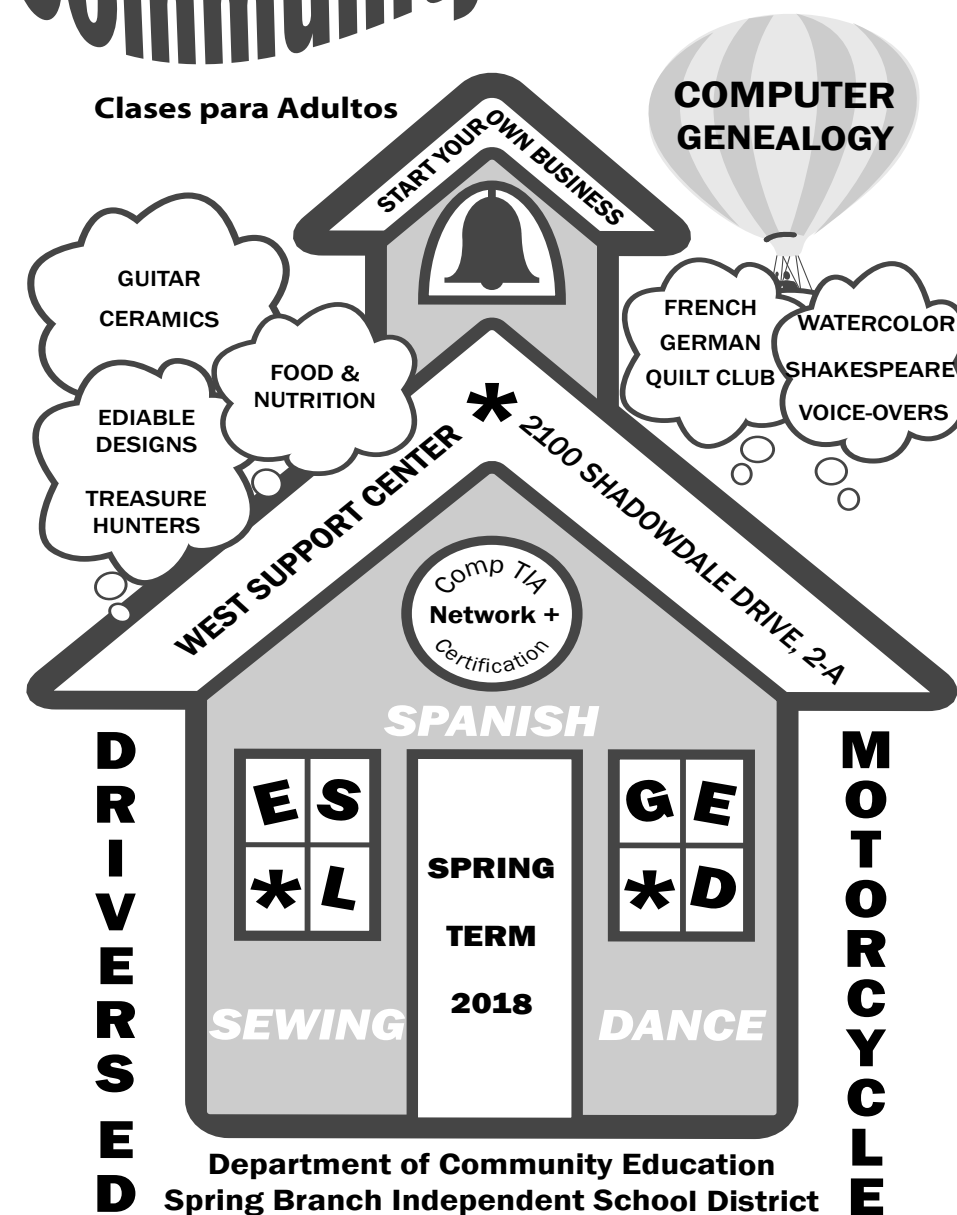

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (E.S.L.) - For the non-English speaker or those who want to improve their English. (Four levels: Beginners, Intermediate, Advanced & Advanced Conversation)

COURSE DESCRIPTION
