

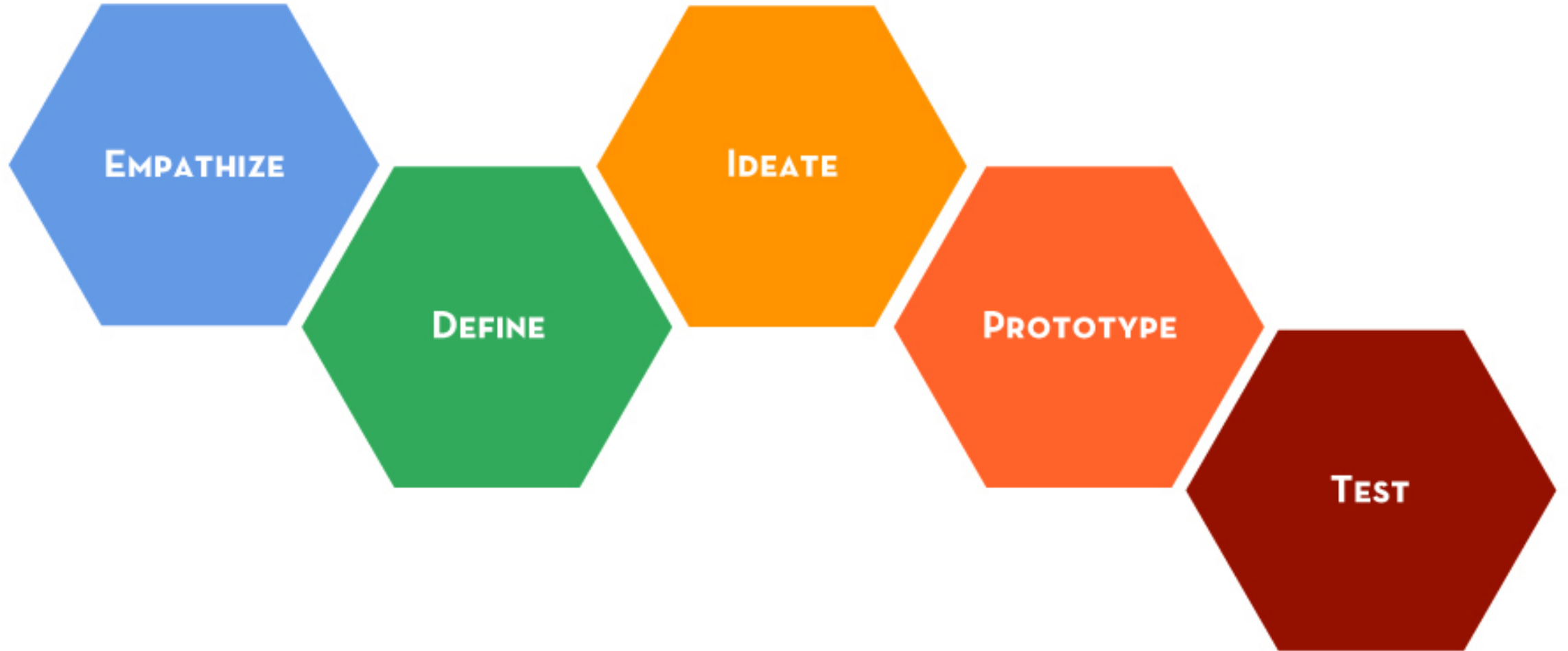

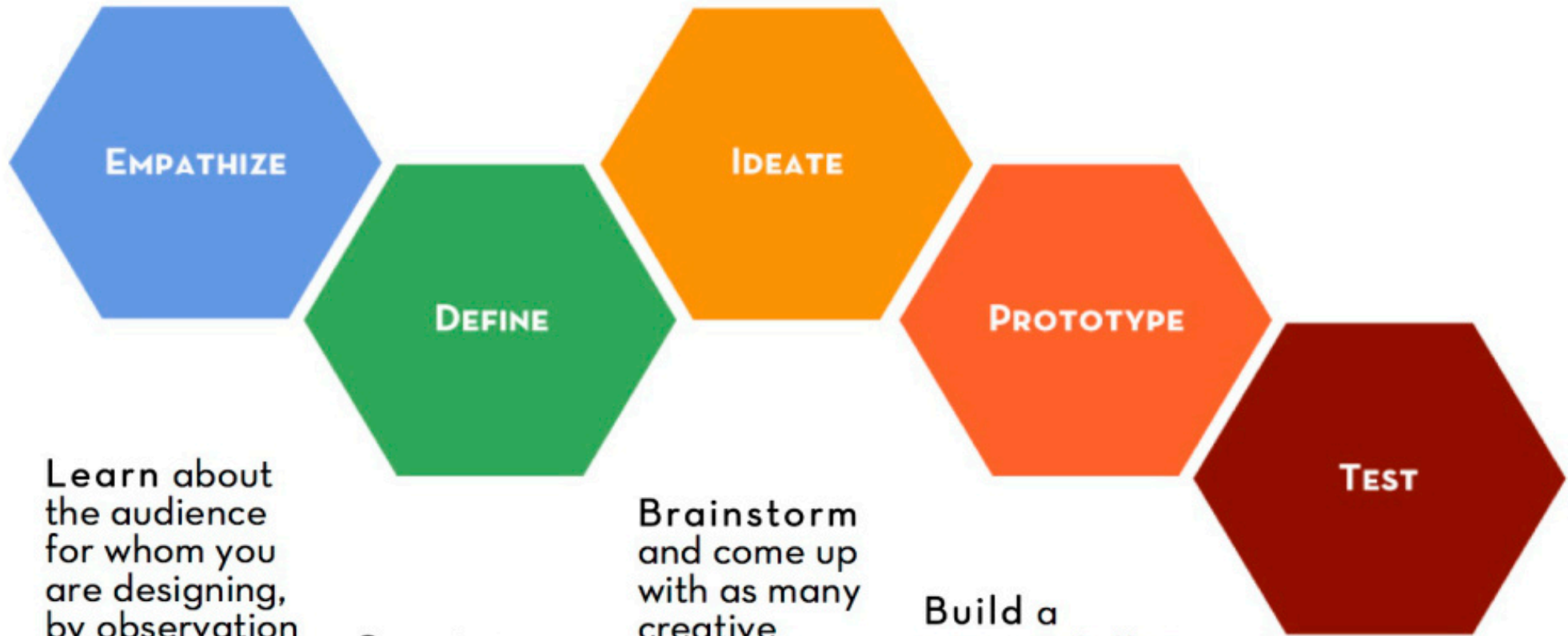

Learn about the audience for whom you are designing, by observation and interview.
Who is my user? What matters to this person?

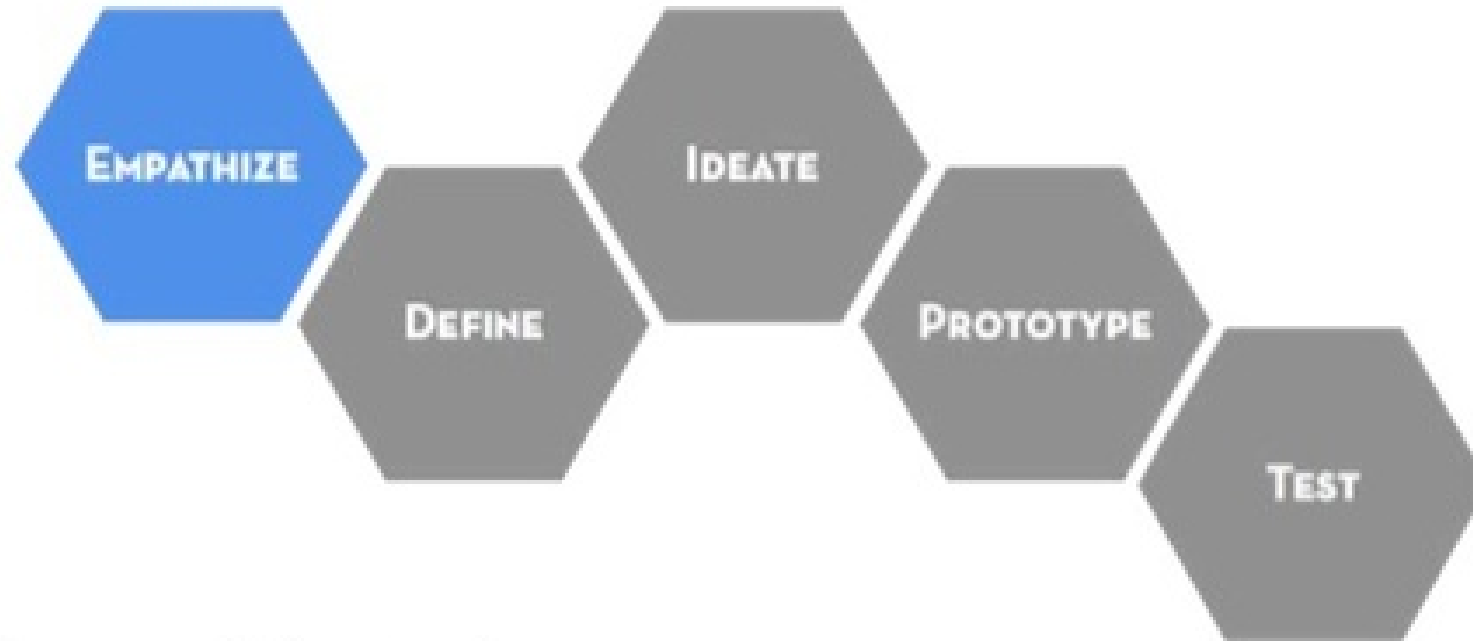
Create a point of view that is based on user needs and insights.
What are their needs?

Brainstorm and come up with as many creative solutions as possible.
Wild ideas encouraged!

Build a representation of one or more of your ideas to show to others.
How can I show my idea? Remember: A prototype is just a rough draft!

Share your prototyped idea with your original user for feedback.
What worked? What didn't?

EMPATHY is the **foundation** of human-centered design thinking.



WHAT is the empathize mode

Empathy is the foundation of a human-centered design process. To empathize, we:

- **Observe.** View users and their behavior in the context of their lives.
- **Engage.** Interact with and interview users through both scheduled and short 'intercept' encounters.
- **Immerse.** Experience what your user experiences.

Persisting inequities are met with innovative approaches to organizing and changemaking to confront some of the world's most pressing challenges.

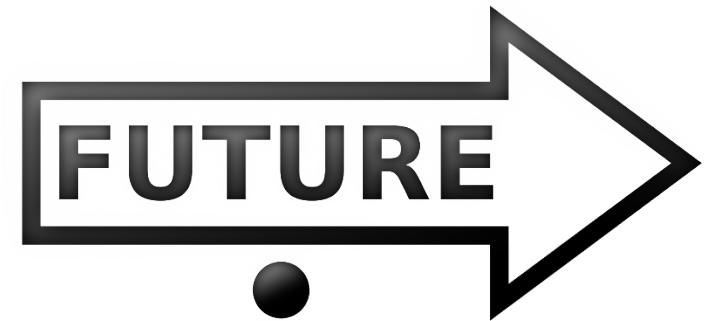
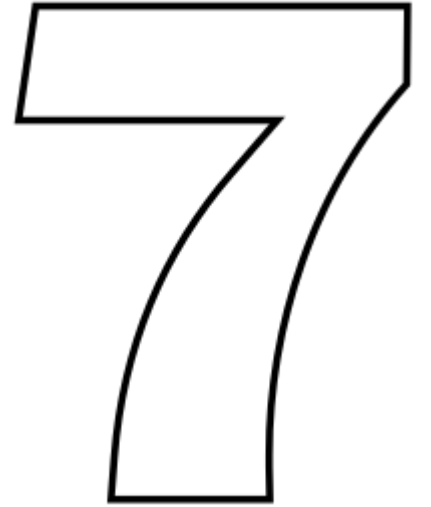
