Fill out a NEW Individual At-Risk Student Record in red (only for those students who don't have a preprinted form).

- 1. For At-Risk students new to your campus.
- 2. For newly identified At-Risk students (Any student who for the first time meets one or more of the established at-risk criteria).
- 3. For At-Risk students who for some reason don't have a preprinted form.
- 4. Mark at the top under AT-RISK X NEW.
- 5. Place an "X" in front of all applicable criteria.
- 6. In the comments section, write such things as qualifying elementary Running Records or MAP scores, secondary foundation courses' grades and semester, or STAAR scores.
- 7. For elementary, the teacher must sign and date at the bottom.
- 8. For secondary, the certified staff member who identifies the student must sign and date the form at the bottom.
- 9. Give the completed new form to the campus At-Risk contact.

Update (change or delete) preprinted At-Risk Student Record forms in red (the date in the upper left hand corner is the date that the form was printed).

- 1. Draw a red line through the "X" before a criteria if it is no longer valid.
- 2. If ALL criteria are exited, mark X Delete under NOT AT-RISK at the top of the page. (The student is no longer At-Risk. He/she has exited the program.)
- 3. Mark at the top under AT-RISK X Change for any revisions to a preprinted form other than those who are deleted because no criteria apply.
- 4. Place an "X" in front of all applicable criteria.
- 5. If there is an obvious error with a marked criteria, draw a red line through the marked criteria. Write error next to it (ex.: A second grade student marked for STAAR who obviously doesn't take STAAR).
- 6. If a student is not currently eligible for a criteria that is marked, draw a red line through the "X" in front of the criteria.
- 7. The same comments, signature and date requirements as above apply.
- 8. Separate the original preprinted forms with changes from those that have no changes. Give all of the forms to your campus At-Risk contact.

Campus At-Risk Contact

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- 1. Please verify that all information (new forms, changes, deletes, etc.) to be input is in red and that it is correct (ex.: No Criteria 5 for a 4th grade student; No Criteria 2 for a 5th grade student, etc.).
- 2. Give forms to At-Risk data input staff. All data must be input before last Wednesday in October in order to be ready for the PEIMS deadline.
- 3. Confirm that At-Risk data input is complete and that the respective input date is on the form.
- 4. Run and review queries to check for errors or missing students.

File At-Risk Student Record Forms

- 1. All individual student At-Risk Student Record forms must be filed in students' Permanent Record Folders (Do not throw away previous years' forms. They remain in the PR folder).
- 2. There will be random PR folder spot checks at selected campuses.

IDENTIFICATION OF HOMELESS STUDENTS

Children and youth in many different living situations are considered homeless under federal law. Homelessness is a lack of permanent housing resulting from extreme poverty or from the lack of a safe and stable living arrangement. Children and youth in homeless situations often do not fit society's stereotypical images of homelessness. Therefore, educators may not realize the breadth of students who are considered homeless under the McKinney-Vento Act and, as such, qualify for its protections and services. The McKinney-Vento Act contains a specific definition of homelessness that includes a broad array of inadequate living situations and contains a more comprehensive definition of homelessness than the Stewart B. McKinney Act, 42 U.S.C. § 11301, et seq. (1994).

Definition of Homelessness (McKinney-Vento Act Sec. 725(2); 42 U.S.C. 11435(2))

The term "homeless children and youths" means:

- (A) individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence...; and
- (B) includes:
 - (i) children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; are abandoned in hospitals; or are awaiting foster care placement;
 - (ii) children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
 - (iii) children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
 - (iv) migratory children who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described in clauses (i) through (iii).
